Following the success of the 'Film Evening' last year, The Par-ish Council has decided to organise another film evening. Lessons have been learnt from last year's event and planning is in progress.


Annual Parish Meeting - Wednesday 16th May 2018

DEFIBRILLATOR

We are pleased to tell you that the new defibrillator has been installed outside the Parish Office in Ryefields Road, fully funded by the Parish Council. It is also the Parish Council's in-tention to install a second defibrillator in the Stoke Heath area in the next few months.

So what is a defibrillator or AED? A defibrillator delivers an electrical current through the chest which aims to shock the heart back into a normal rhythm allowing it to pump again. Rapid response using automated technology can significantly improve the quality of life of a survivor, as the longer the brain is starved of oxygen, the more damage can occur.

An AED is a portable defibrillator which uses intelligent technology to restore a 'shockable' heart rhythm. When applied to a patient, a sequence of voice commands and screen mes-sages guide the user through the defibrillation process. This means that the machine may be used safely by people with no medical background or training. An AED is not restricted to use by trained personnel only, it is totally user friendly.

OUTDOOR FILM NIGHT 2018


After the success of last year's event, the Parish Council is pleased to announce that the outdoor film night will be back again this year. Please note the date in your diary - Saturday 14th July 2018.

They achieved their 2017 YE target of £55,000 and are now striving to raise in excess of £70,000 by the end of 2018. This will be challenging but with help it is achievable.



To do this write to be gifted aided on the reverse of your cheque along with the first line of your address and post code. They will do the rest.


